My parents shifted to Madurai and started a small grocery shop as then the income from agriculture was not sufficient for our extended family. Hence I would say that no strong educational or knowledgeable family background is needed to become a CA. I did my schooling in Tamil medium and couldn't pass in X Public exam in the first attempt. I took third group in +2 completed my B.Com and continued M.Com from the same

college.

Only when I was doing my M.Com, did I come to know about CA Profession from CA. G. Jeyaseelan, who was a visiting faculty at our college. As you can see, literally anyone and at any point in their life time, can decide, enrol and become a CA. While I was studying B.Com I got an opportunity to study all folk art forms like Karagattam, Kavadiyattam, Dummy horse dance, Nandhi dance and Kummi while my fellow students took to western dance and singing cine songs. My relatives teased me and demotivated me with their harsh words.

But still, I participated in many inter-college and inter-University competitions and won medals for myself and my college. I also performed Karagattam at family functions, Temple festivals, Govt functions and other events. The remuneration I got from these events helped me to buy CA books. People around me criticized that I was only good at dancing and my dream to become a CA would be just a dream. I proved them all wrong with my persistence and hard work. Karagattam gave me great concentration power and taught me to be focused on my work and neglect the screams and criticism of other people. But both my father and mother, though they did not understand the profession I chose, supported me whole-heartedly. ACCIDENTAL CHARTERED ACCOUNTANT

I can call myself as an accidental CA rather than a planned CA. Did I want to study CA? NO, but circumstances made me take the path of CA and now after 34 years of my completing CA, am I regretting it? again a BIG NO.

To go back to my student days, I wanted to become an Engineer. But, since marks were not adequate in plus two for an engineering seat, I ended up in B.Sc. Maths. Even at that time I was hoping to pursue some higher Mathematics as my option, GOD decided other way.

My father took me to his office one day and from there we ended up in an audit office and my father introduced me to the partner (who is known to him). Partner asked me few questions and commented that "I should always wear the top shirt button, I should not wear T-shirts to office, should wear shoes", and so many other firm rules. I was helpless and they both decided that I do CA. The partner asked me to come after a few days and join the firm. It is a big firm, with lot of corporate audits and public sector audits, with less tax work.

With so much reluctance, I went to the office on the first day. It was a long journey from Tambaram to end of Mount Road. After the initial introductions I was asked to wait in the long and large table in the hall. I waited for two hours and getting more and more bored. Some students were coming and going, there was one old male typist, old female typist, reasonably aged telephone operator, building was high rise with huge columns in old British style.

By around noon, a middle-aged person (who was also a partner I came to know later), called me and gave me a huge note book and wanted me to calculate the total of all the figures (a long trial balance actually!) and put it down by pencil. I should total by mind and not use a calculator. I tried, and every time my total was wrong. I tried till 2.00 p.m., no good, and the junior partner asked me to take lunch and come back and start again.



After lunch, I was afraid now, I tried again and again, no use, every time some mistake kept happening. I slowly got good headache and I was looking totally lost in the office. Junior partner saw my plight and said "hey, ok, don't worry, this is only to improve your concentration and not to test you, now take rest, if you want to go back home, go and come tomorrow". Immediately I came out and landed in my home. I protested to father that this will not help me and I am more jittery. But my father said "he believes me and I can study CA".

Next few days, I was not given any audit assignments and I was simply sitting in office and spending time. One boy named Suresh, came to me and asked me to join him in some small work he was doing. I remember, it was some PF fund audit in some small company. So, I went with him and assisted him. He had written his final and was waiting for the results. He was of my age only as he has completed the foundation and has done his B. Com in evening college.

After two days, I was again back in audit office in the morning, waiting for the senior Suresh to come. This is the moment that I would say that has changed my life forever. So far, I was reluctant, I wanted to discontinue CA and go back to Maths, and was looking for good opportunity to drop out of CA.

Suddenly two, three boys came in and were talking in a loud voice, "this time also Suresh is the First, great". I could not understand and asked what is this all about. They said "CA Final results have come and Suresh, who was working with me for few days, has come ALL INDIA FIRST IN FINAL!!!!!!!" I could not believe myself and not only this is surprisingly shocking to me, I came to know that Suresh has earlier stood FIRST IN CA INTER ALSO. I could not believe this as the young chap of my age, was now the topper not once, but twice. I have so far, heard only people failing and attempting number of times.



That is the first time some thing happened to me and I thought when someone is getting such high laurels in front of my eyes, why not I also try to atleast pass? This is a true story and people can verify the results in May 1985 and 1984 exams results.

Thereafter, slowly I started studying. But since, I came from non-commerce, I could not understand even small concepts. There were no coaching centres like today. We had few CA members who were teaching at Mylapore. I joined in one class for accountancy with Mr. Nagarajan. His classes used to start at 6.00 am in Mylapore, Lady Sivasamay Iyer school. I will start from Tambaram at 4.30 am and my father used to accompany me to Railway station. I will reach T. Nagar by 5.15 am, take the bus and reach school by 5.45 or so. This continued for three months and after that I was posted to some outstation audit work, I could not attend the classes. But the foundation lessons were so good, and I slowly studied on my own (without Mr. Nagarajan, no accounts).

Accounts was ok, Tax was a struggle, Costing fine, Law I could not mug up, and only consolation was Maths and Statistics paper (we had in those days, now discontinued). I could not sit in November 1986 exam due to typhoid and sat for May 1987 exam. Exam was in Mylapore centre. First day, accounts exam, and once the question paper was given, my hands were trembling, legs were shaky, heart was pumping so fast, I could not see the question paper for next 10 solid minutes. I could not place the pen on the paper and write my number and could not hold the pen.

I prayed to all the GODs and waited for the fear to settle down, slowly I looked into the question paper. Luckily some question had come which I had studied earlier. So, I wrote, but I could see the other students were busy in putting lines in pencil, centre lines, T lines etc and were writing busily. I slowly picked up and wrote few questions and even though I did not put pencil lenes, etc. I think I wrote mostly correct answers. Next day slowly I picked up courage and wrote the other exams which continued for seven days. But the full satisfaction was Maths and Statistics paper, which I wrote excellently well.



Now after few weeks, the results were coming and we all went to see the results in Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, SIRC Nungambakkam. Every one was pushing here and there. I was looking one set of charts and found my name was not there. I went to the other one and found my name was not there also. I didn't know how to see the results. I thought I have failed in both the groups and moved away from the crowds, and now I didn't know what to do. How to inform to my father was the main concern. Suddenly a friend came and asked, and I told him my numbers were not on the board, he again dragged me to another board and Surprise!!! My name was there on the list!!!!, I could not believe my eyes (even as I write this article, I could feel the sensation in my mind and my body), my name was on the list of Both groups completed students, Yes!!, I have passed both groups!! Suddenly a gush of happiness was running all over me.

I came back to my office and informed and every one was congratulating me and asking what is my marks. I do not know, in those days, you can go to first floor in the SIRC and get the marks from some clerk. I was not even aware of this. Another friend helped me in the afternoon and we got my marks, really a good score. I got 50/50 in Maths and 45/50 in Statistics and other papers around 50 to 65. People were indicating I may get a rank. Again a surprise came after few days, the Rank was released and I stood at All India 27th in Intermediate CA exam. Something which I did not even dream off!! This really has increased my confidence ten times and my final was a smooth sailing with first attempt pass, even though without any rank. In the meanwhile, I enrolled for ICWAI and again easily cleared Inter and Final in first attempts.

This is not self-bragging and boasting article. This is to tell the students and readers that CA is a passable course. Only you need someone to inspire you to study hard and, in my case, it was Mr. Suresh Rajagopalan, who I cannot forget in my life time, my father who strongly believed I can study and pass, Mr. Nagarajan, who planted the initial accountancy lessons in my life.



Now, even after so many years of working in corporate sector and now recently in practice, am I satisfied with my becoming CA? Certainly, yes and I have no regrets. CA has given me my job, my earning and status in society. But, somewhere at the back of the mind I am still a Maths student and I miss my first love and I compensate this by enjoying solving some puzzles and reading interesting maths articles and following what is happening in Maths world around.

I Cleared CA because of people around me trusted in me.

In my Secondary school, I was good at Mathematics. When we were discussing about future career courses, my friend trusting my knowledge in Mathematics suggested me to take Commerce group since Accountancy involve more numbers. Believing her idea, I took Commerce group at Higher Secondary School.

At higher secondary, I was taking private education for my main exams. From that time, I began to search about the course with my available network.

After completing higher secondary, I joined a Bachelor degree as per my decision. But the thought of pursuing CA would come and go in my mind. After coming to know that my cousin was pursuing CA course, I thought I would try the course. My idea was "I will pursue CA if I clear my CA CPT at First attempt, otherwise will drop from the course".



I joined a private coaching for CA CPT course, my teacher was really a miracle in my CA career. He built great confidence in every student. It helped me to drop from my college after clearing CA CPT at first attempt. Of course, dropping off from college could not be possible without the trust of my mother and sister in me. After clearing CA Inter, I joined a mid-sized audit firm. My articleship experience was so great.

My partners who had trust in me gave the best work exposure including international experience which I have never thought in my dream.

Like many of the students, I also started my preparation for CA Final at end of my 3rd year articleship But I was clueless about where to begin, what to study, how to proceed further, etc.? I didn't have any senior in my firm to ask all these questions. At that time, as seen in movies, God sent an Angel to my life. I met her in Advance ITT Class. She was attending the same after clearing CA (old course).

At mid of 2020 where govt announced lockdown, I called her for guidance for all my questions. Everyday she really spent 2 - 3 hours a day to guide me, to clear my doubts on subjects and to complete the syllabus on time for exams

I cleared my CA final in Dec 2021, it was my 3rd attempt. But whenever I could not make my exams, her trust in me pushed to go ahead and prepare for next.

I remember the day of my result, where my friends, teachers, partners and families all celebrated my result as their success. The journey doesn't end here, a new beginning started, again people around me trust that I will be the best in my professional journey.

MY CA JOURNEY

Chartered Accountancy!

The career choice never known to me until the public results of Class X were published. Science Group and the resultant Engineering was out of choice, not because of the marks, but of the monetary implications it had!

CA - the name as well as the course entered my life, just like it waves 'Hi' to most of the middle-class families - a Budget friendly professional course.

The inclination towards science and the dreams of Engineering made the most practical subjects like Commerce and Economics the most theoretical one. Accountancy was just an extension of Math with some weird logics - Credit and Debit!

The bias of the commerce student who wanted to pursue science influenced me until I went into a practical internship as a part of my under-graduation programme in commerce, wherein I was made to work under an auditor for one month!

My friend and I were assigned with vouching a Purchase Register under the supervision of an Audit Manager. We went to some shop wherein we were provided with 3 files of purchase bills and a register that had the list of all these bills. We were made to check whether both matches with each other. The time allotted was 2 days!!!

Without getting the instruction right, my friend and I finished the purchase bills of the entire year within the first half of the day and produced it before the Audit Manager for getting appreciated for the quick completion of the task assigned!



Our audit manager got held up in some other client's works and was unable to check our works. Longing for appreciation and left with no options, we then decided to get direct appreciations from the Auditor itself and went to him conveying the message that the task is completed with 100% accuracy! He gave us the most complex reaction, which I still feel difficult to translate into words.

What happened then was the life changing and 'Shri Gurubhyo Namaha' moment for me.

The auditor himself sat with us and explained the essence of our activity

- Vouching! Never in our life, until then, I have looked into the details of the bills for the purchases I made. Instantly all the content in the invoices made more meaning to us! The purchase bills conveyed us the story, the synopsis of which were in the counterpart - Purchase Register!

The biggest take away is the perception with which we need to look at the things! The same thing with higher perception gives a wider scope for interpretation. With a wider understanding about the vouching, we tried to Ctrl + Z and carried on Ctrl + Y the entire vouching activity.

This time, the time we took was more and the way we analysed the purchase bills were deeper. After finishing the activity by the end of the next day, we went to our auditor again with queries that ran to at least 10 pages, for which we expected at least a half a page of appreciation!

What we got again was the same complex reaction, but the takeaway was different altogether!



I have never questioned my question until that day when our auditor questioned us to explain what exactly our question is! He made me realise that questioning the question before asking the question makes the question relevant and most importantly, it makes the question answerable! Most importantly, most of our queries were not even qualifying the same. And the qualified quantum doesn't even exceed our half a page appreciation threshold!

In another instance during the internship, my auditor and I happened to sit on Bank Reconciliation Statement.

While I was expecting the scenario wherein the cheques deposited but not cleared and other reconciliation items would be provided readymade just like our assured 20 marks question of Higher Secondary, what I was provided with was the Bank statement and the Bank book along with the monthly BRS which they prepare, instead. That Reconciliation statement had various amounts, mapped with cheque number, which were either added or reduced from the Bank Book to arrive at the Bank Statement amount.

My auditor comes in again!!!

That reconciliation activity reconciled the deviation between the theories and the practicality of the subjects I had been studying!

Also, I was in awe of how practical my entire higher studies were! Suddenly I started to understand the language of Credit and Debit! Also appreciate the poems that were made from it in the name of Financials and Reports!

I understood how the questions for my exams were made and appreciated the beauty of the subjects!



I would have appreciated my schooling and college education much more if they were to teach me the subjects, the way my auditor had taught me.

I wish he was my Class XI teacher!

I even mentioned the same in my college internship project report emphasising the impact that 30 days training programme created in me and changed the entire course of my career.

Engineering was my choice before 10th. Joining Military was my choice after 12th! But that 30 days of training programme made 'CA' to win a cold war against both!

One who loves the subject most and dedicated his life towards it alone can transmit the same unto you! I am forever grateful to my auditor, who planted the seed - CA within a span of 30 days!!!!

There is no tree without a Seed!

A tree is made when the seed sprouts, though it is viewed as a Tree only upon its growth.

Going by this logic, it's that 30 days of Internship that made me CA (Seed).

And 30 \times '30 days programme' spanning around 3 years called 'Articleship' made me a 'CA'.
