## BLOCKCHAIN AND THE FUTURE OF AUDITING: WILL TRADITIONAL AUDITS DISAPPEAR?

As a CA student observing the profession during my articleship, I have noticed how rapidly technology is changing the way businesses operate. One technology that has gained significant attention in recent years is blockchain. While it is commonly associated with cryptocurrencies, its potential impact on auditing and financial reporting is equally important. In my opinion, blockchain has the potential to change how auditors verify transactions, maintain transparency, and ensure the reliability of financial information.

### **Understanding Blockchain:**

In simple terms, blockchain is a digital ledger where transactions are recorded in blocks and connected in a chronological chain. Once a transaction is recorded on the blockchain, it becomes extremely difficult to alter or delete it.

This technology offers several advantages, including:

- Greater transparency in transaction records
- Strong security through cryptography
- Real-time verification of transactions
- Reduced risk of data manipulation

Because of these features, blockchain has the potential to increase the reliability of financial data that auditors rely on during an audit.

### **How Blockchain Can Transform Auditing:**

From my perspective, blockchain could significantly influence traditional auditing practices in several ways.

#### **I. Real-Time Verification:**

Instead of verifying transactions only at the end of the financial year, auditors may be able to review and verify transactions as they occur.

### **II. Reduced Dependence on Sampling:**

Traditional audits often rely on sampling because of the large number of transactions. Blockchain systems may allow auditors to analyze all transactions rather than just a sample, improving audit accuracy.

### **III. Better Fraud Prevention:**

Since blockchain records are extremely difficult to alter, the possibility of financial manipulation or fraud could be reduced. Professional bodies such as the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India and International organizations like the International Federation of Accountants have also emphasized the importance of understanding emerging technologies in the accounting profession.

A practical example of blockchain implementation can be seen in the IBM Food Trust platform, developed by IBM and used by companies such as Walmart. This blockchain system records every stage of the food supply chain from farmers to retailers on a shared ledger. Earlier, tracing the origin of food products during contamination issues could take several days. With blockchain technology, the same information can now be traced within seconds.

From an auditor's point of view, such systems provide transparent and tamper-resistant transaction records, making verification faster and more reliable.

### **Will Blockchain Replace Auditors?**

A common question that arises is whether blockchain will eventually replace auditors. In my view, technology will support auditors rather than replace them.

Even with blockchain systems in place, auditors will still need to:

- Evaluate the reliability of blockchain systems
- Assess internal controls and governance structures
- Verify transactions that occur outside the blockchain
- Apply professional judgment and skepticism

Therefore, the role of Chartered Accountants will remain important even in a technology-driven environment.

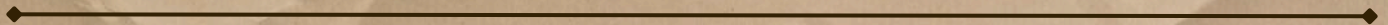
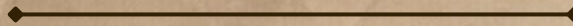

### **Challenges and Opportunities:**

Although blockchain offers many advantages, its adoption still faces several challenges. These include limited implementation across industries, regulatory uncertainties, and the need for technical knowledge. For CA students and future professionals, this creates an opportunity to develop technological awareness and adapt to the evolving profession.

In my opinion, blockchain should not be viewed as a threat to the auditing profession but rather as a tool that can enhance audit efficiency and transparency. As the profession evolves, Chartered Accountants must combine their traditional auditing knowledge with an understanding of emerging technologies. In the future, auditors may not only examine financial statements but also evaluate the technological systems that generate financial information.

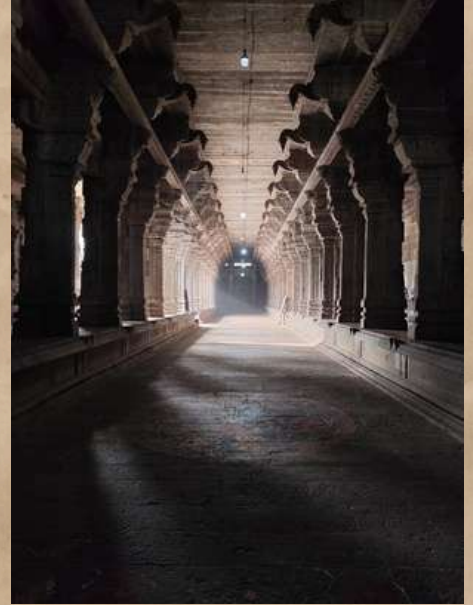

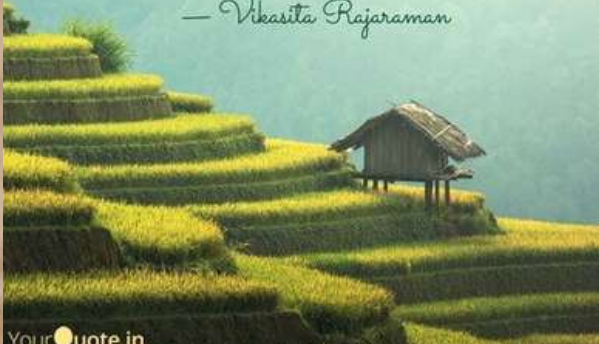

With rising incomes of salaried class individuals and the percentage of second generation kids pushing the economic consumption to an all-time high, Anant Khanna, a 23 year old graduate of IIT Mumbai, betting on this new market segment, started a digital credit payback platform under the name of Money Mox.

The company began its operations last year and has already accumulated a customer base of around two million active users. One of the reasons to enter this market was the disruptive technology already in place because of earlier FinTech startups. It was easy to mold the available infrastructure and build a platform. The idea of the company is simple; make a gated community of high income - high spending individuals and reward them for their purchases via credit and debit cards.

The company made news recently with global investors finding it attractive to bet on. Following which, Josh Kattings, an early investor, met with the team and advised them to not just copy what Batuya, the key competitor with a different business model was doing, but to learn, improve and better the process for customers.

Surprisingly, Josh also offered Batuya to work along with Money Mox for better penetration, but Anant and team did not agree to the same so early on. They had issues with their current infrastructure and rather wanted to outshine the competition, than to shake hands and grow together.

The company last month shared their revenue projections publicly and it attracted a lot of old players in banking to take note of the new technology. The leader in this sentiment was CBZ Bank which offered to buy Money Mox for 50 crores against a 100% equity deal.

Anant and team are yet to respond to the enormous offer from a well-established bank, but this surely speaks volume about how unique ideas are valued in the developing economies like India.

## ANSWERS TO MULTIPLE CHOICE QUESTIONS

### 1. Option (c) Stop-Light Strategy Model

#### Reason:

The Stop-Light Strategy Model (also associated with the GE Matrix) evaluates business units or industries based on market attractiveness (e.g., disruptive technology, rising market potential) and business strength (e.g., rapid growth of the user base and customer acquisition rate). Money Mox entered the FinTech market based on these two key factors, aligning with the Stop-Light Model rather than SWOT Analysis.

### 2. Option (b) Focused Differentiation Strategy

#### Reason:

Money Mox targets a niche market (high-income, high-spending individuals) by offering a unique service (credit payback rewards for card purchases). This is a clear example of focused differentiation, where a company tailors its product or service to a specific market segment with unique value propositions.

### 3. Option (d) Only A and B

#### Reason:

- A. Trade secrets can be spilled out: Collaboration may lead to unintentional disclosure of proprietary processes or strategies.
- B. Ally may become a competitor: Partnerships can lead to shared knowledge, which might make the ally a strong competitor in the future.
- C is incorrect because sharing skills and technology typically lowers costs through economies of scale, not increases them.

Thus, the downsides considered are only A and B.

### 4. Option (a) High Power, High Interest (Key Players)

#### Reason:

As an early investor and advisor, Josh Kattings holds significant power (financially and strategically) and has high interest in Money Mox's success. He qualifies as a "Key Player" who should be engaged closely and consulted in critical decision-making.

### 5. Option (d) Co-generic Merger

**Reason:**

CBZ Bank operates in the financial services sector, and Money Mox is a FinTech startup within the same broad domain. This acquisition is a co generic merger, as it involves two companies in related industries but with different operational aspects, aiming to create synergy.
